Newhall certainly tested that theory. He and fellow Savoonga Team Alaska Basketball players Caelin Kingeekuk and Angel Toolie came to Nome in December to apply for passports using plane tickets donated by Bering Air. But while Kin-geekuk and Toolie had birth certificates, Newhall did not. His friend's passports arrived two weeks before the travel date. Newhall's application, however, had been put on hold, and he began to think he might not be able to attend. Then, as a lastditch effort nine days before he was to leave Savoonga, Newhall applied for an "emergency" birth certificate which he had expedited to the passport office in New Hampshire. From there, Frampton and Chef de Mission assistant Holly Odegard were able to enlist the help of United States Senator Lisa Murkowski to have Newhall's application given priority and sent immediately to Anchorage. The passport arrived at the Team Alaska office with only one day to spare.

Once in Canada, Newhall realized his experience was about much more than basketball. "It was about making new friends and seeing new things and meeting new people," he said. He especially enjoyed the AWG tradition of trading uniforms with athletes from around the world at the end of the week. "I got a Nunavut jersey and some Nunavut snow pants." For his perseverance, Team Alaska chose Newhall to help carry the Alaska banner during the opening ceremonies.

The female and male Team Alaska Basketball squads placed fourth and fifth, respectively.

The head coach for the 2023 Team Alaska male volleyball unit in Northern Alberta was Brooks Fry. He was the Mixed Six head volleyball coach in Anaktuvuk Pass for nine years before becoming a teacher at Nome-Beltz for the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 school years. His squad included Carter Kokeok and Frank Ningeulook of Shishmaref, Tristan Ashenfelter of White Mountain, and his son Calvin Fry. The team placed fifth at the games.

Fry mentioned that the only Alaska School Activities Association high school volleyball opportunities for male athletes occur in rural Mixed Six (coed) competitions. "Mixed Six, especially at the conference and state championship levels, prepares athletes for the mental exertion, focus, and strength required to play at a highly competitive level," said Frey. "Six out of ten of my players this year were from rural communities and had Mixed Six experience. There was a clear difference between some of the athletes with high-pressure game experience and athletes with only practice and rec team experience. I could definitely see that potentially being ten out of ten in the future.'

For many years, athletes from Western Alaska have qualified for Team Alaska's biathlon and crosscountry ski teams through the Western Interior Ski and Biathlon Championships. These are two of the most competitive sports at the games. Representing Western Alaska and Unalakleet on the 2023 Team Alaska Biathlon squads were Cedar

Busk (Ski Biathlon), Ourea Busk (Ski Biathlon), and Violet Jack (Snowshoe Biathlon). The trio accounted for one relay ulu and five individual ulus. The highlight was Jack's gold ulu in the mass start race.

Unalakleet's Ayuu Roesch and Trevin Soderstrom competed on the Team Alaska Cross-country units.

Unalakleet Nordic Head Coach Matt Roesch was a 2023 Team Alaska Biathlon coaching staff member. He said, the Unalakleet biathletes and skiers trained diligently throughout the summer and fall, roller-skiing around town, hiking to the summer shooting range, and also attended camps in Anchorage and Soldier Hollow, Utah.

Other 2023 Arctic Winter Games athletes with ties to Nome included Katlyn Smith, Nome (Arctic Sports), Alukka Ivanoff, Unalakleet (Arctic Sports), Wookie Nichols, Nome (Dene Games), Owen Hebel, Nome (Dene Games), Robert Ahmasuk, Anchorage (Downhill Skiing), Kael Erickson, Unalakleet (Basketball), Stanley Booth, Nome (Basketball), Lane Schuerch, Nome (Basketball), Laura Kugzruk, Brevig Mission (Basketball), and Delaney Fagerstrom, Anchorage (Table Tennis).

After competing on the Team Alaska cross-country skiing squad in Greenland in 2016 and the Team Alaska Ski Biathlon unit in the Northwest Territories in 2018, Mallory Conger moved up to the biathlon coaching staff for the 2023 games.
