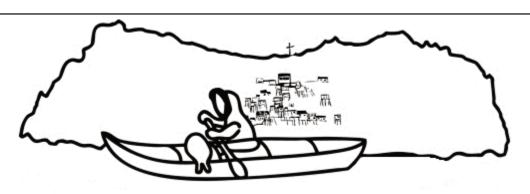

The Alaska Bureau of Investigation is now conducting a thorough investigation into the incident; once complete, their investigation will then be independently reviewed by the Alaska Office of Special Prosecutions. The name of the trooper that discharged their service weapons will be released after 72 hours per department policy.

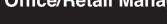
