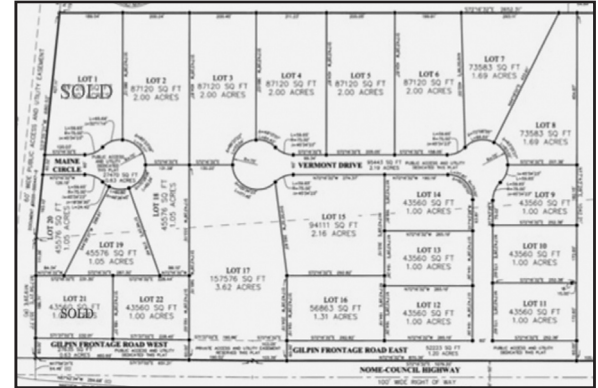

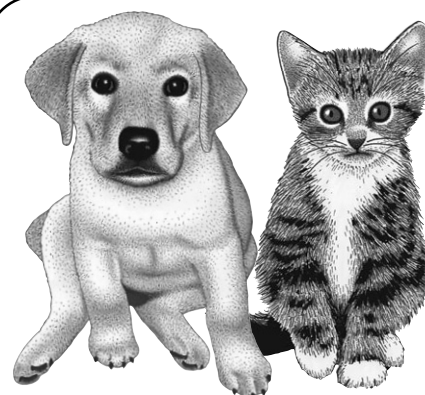

Gentlemen:


It has come to my attention that State of Alaska Mining Claim location monuments have been placed on WMNC (White Mountain Native Corporation) land on the uplands at Bluff in an area well marked and noticed against trespassing.

On June 10, 2022, Senator Donnie Olson and I organized a trip to investigate trespass issues on the beach and upland area at Bluff. We observed and photographed a number of your mining claim location monuments placed on and within WMNC land.

We used a GPS, the Bering Sea strandline and BLM cadastral survey markers, to verify that the location monuments were on WMNC uplands. A search of recorded location certificates for the area indicated that the only mining claims in the area that included WMNC land within the claim boundaries are yours. WMNC lands are not open to State of Alaska mineral locations.

You are hereby notified that these claim locations constitute criminal trespass.
