Trooper Beat

On July 29, 2020 at 9:30 p.m. The Alaska State Troopers received a report of an assault that occurred at a remote camp, 30 miles from Stebbins. Several families had been out camping. The investigation revealed that 43-year-old, John Aluska became angry after an argument with a family member. Aluska then threatened to kill everyone and then himself. He shot at two people and pointed a rifle at several others. Aluska poured gas on a family member while threatening to burn her. John did

burn a 100-year old cabin to the ground. Due to heavy recent rainfall, the fire was contained to within 30 yards of the cabin. The cabin and its contents were a total loss. John fled from responding troopers but later turned himself in. John Aluska is charged with two counts of attempted Murder II, Arson II, Assault III DV, Terroristic Threatening II, Criminal Mischief III and Misconduct Weapons IV.

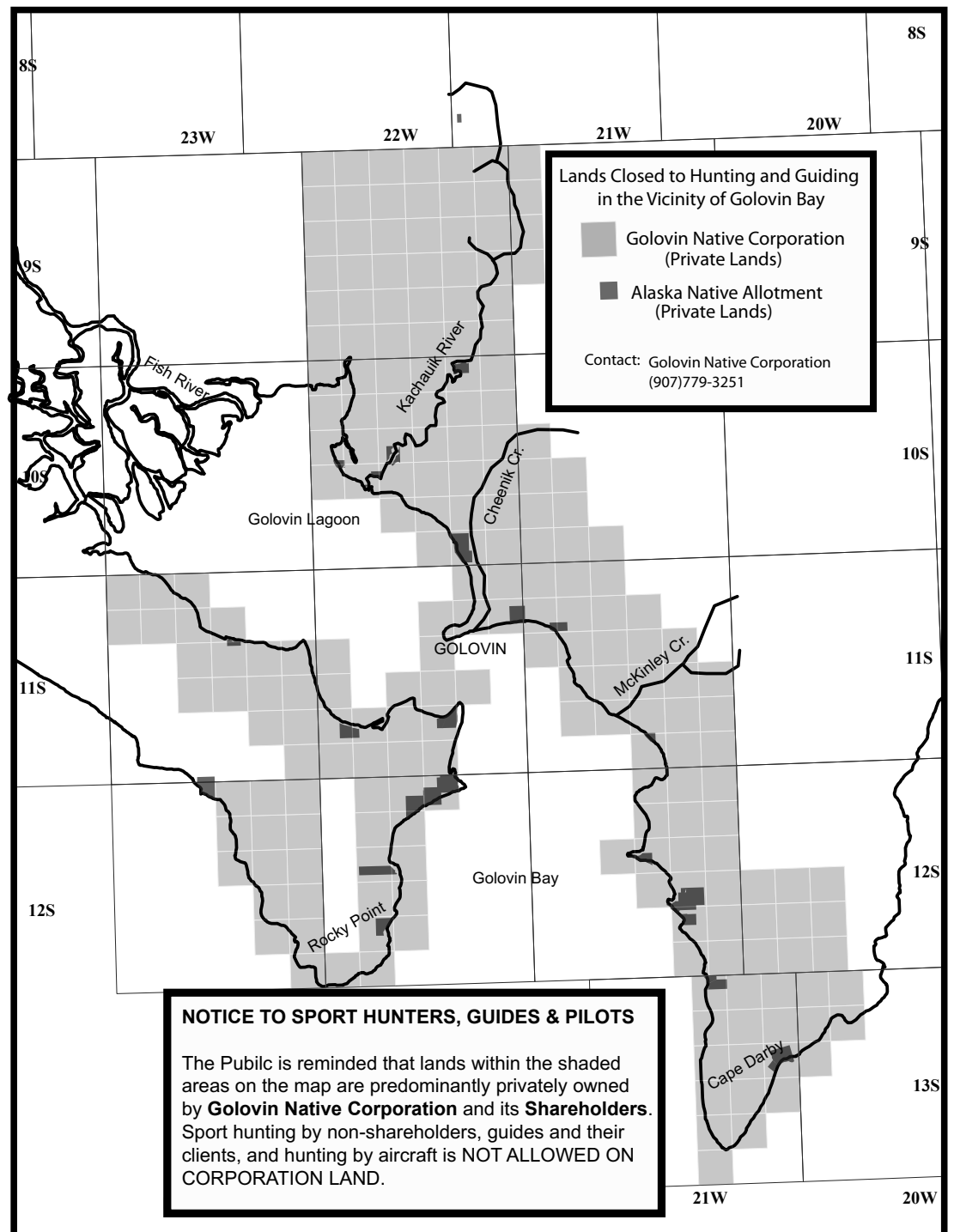

eyes, 1,600 pinks, 10,000 chums and 120 silvers by 9 permit holders. The chum catch is near the recent 10-year average but less than half the catch of the last two years.

Subsistence Fishing: Open 7 days a week.

Fish River Tower – Cooperative project; NSEDC with assistance from Fish & Game.

Cumulative counts through August 3 were 72 kings, 18 sockeyes, 7,900 chums, 2.4 million pinks and 1,800 silvers. All counts are minimal. Project started late and there were no counts between July 15 and July 27.

Nome Subdistrict

Commercial Fishing: Cumulative catch is 32 kings, 230 sockeyes, 6,000 chums, 400 pinks and 240 silvers by 6 permit holders. The chum catch is above the recent 5-year average but less than half of last year's catch.

Subsistence Fishing: Net fishing schedule in all fresh water subsistence areas and the marine waters west of Cape Nome is open from 6 p.m. Wednesday until 6 p.m. Monday. East of Cape Nome the marine waters are open 7 days a week. There are no catch limits when fishing in marine waters. Check the subsistence salmon permit for the fresh water catch limits that vary by river. Beach seines, cast nets, dip nets and set gillnets can be used during the net fishing schedule, but only in the subsistence areas.

Eldorado River Weir - Escapement goal: Chum 4,400 – 14,200 – NSEDC project.

Project complete. Cumulative counts through August 1 were 21 kings, 74 sockeyes, 11,250 chums, 164,000 pinks and 33 silvers.

Nome River Weir - Escapement goal: Chum 1,600 – 5,300; Pink 13,000 – Fish & Game project.

Cumulative counts through August 3 were 7 kings, 165 sockeyes, 1,800 chums, 1.8 million pinks and 190 silvers.

Snake River Weir - Escapement goal: Chum 2,000 – 4,200 – NSEDC project.

Cumulative counts through August 3 were 2 kings, 140 sockeyes, 520 chums, 330,000 pinks and 42 silvers.

Solomon River Weir – Fish & Game project.

Cumulative counts through August 3 were 3 kings, 49 sockeyes, 640 chums, 400,000 pinks and 60 silvers.

Port Clarence District

Subsistence gillnet and beach seining is open 7 days a week.

Pilgrim River Floating Weir: Escapement goal: Sockeye 6,800 – 36,000 – NSEDC project.

Cumulative counts through August 3 were 54 kings, 10,400 sockeyes, 4,100 chums, 78,000 pinks and 160 silvers. The sockeye counts have picked up again. The department will fly again this week to see if more sockeyes have reached the Salmon Lake and Grand Central River spawning areas. In late July the numbers on the spawning grounds were below expected and likely attributable to subsistence harvest upstream of the weir. At this time the sockeye subsistence limit will remain 25 fish for the season for each household and give those households that have not reached the limit a chance to get more sockeyes.

Kotzebue

Cumulative catch is 68,000 chums by 50 permit holders. Compared to same time last year this year's catch is half of last year's catch with a little more than half the number of permit holders fish-

ing. Scale aging analysis has shown a weak return of 4-year-old chum salmon. The department has reduced commercial fishing this week to one-third the normal fishing time compared to recent years. *Kobuk River Test Fish - Fish & Game project.*

The chum catches have been poor and sheefish catches good. Catches are expected to improve this week with the limited commercial fishing time.


