Trooper Beat

Unalakleet / Saint Michael
Assault: On August 10, 2026, at 3:13 a.m., the Alaska State Troopers received a report of a domestic violence assault in the village of Saint Michael. Investigation revealed that 25-year-old Stebbins resident Tristan Thrasher had threatened and assaulted two individuals. Following the assault, Thrasher left the residence with his firearm and departed on an ATV with three of his friends. Nome based AST, Alaska Wildlife Troopers, and the Western Alaska Alcohol and Narcotics team responded to Saint Michael. Troopers encountered Thrasher and the three other individuals on the roadway between Saint Michael and Stebbins. Thrasher failed to stop for the Troopers and continued into Stebbins. Thrasher and the three individuals with him then positioned themselves on a bluff and Thrasher announced he wanted to have a shootout with the Troopers. Troopers established containment around the bluff, and the Crisis Negotiation Team (CNT) began communicating with Thrasher via cell phone. Shortly after contact was established, the three individuals with Thrasher surrendered. CNT continued communicating with Thrasher, and he ultimately surrendered to Troopers without incident and was taken into custody for two counts of Assault in the third degree and two counts of Assault in the Presence of a Minor. The investigation is ongoing, and additional charges are pending.

Unalakleet
SAM 1, Production of CSAM, Burglary 1: On August 10, at 12:44 p.m., the Alaska State Troopers arrested 22-year-old Unalakleet resident Bruce Eakon Jr. on an outstanding warrant that stemmed from a July burglary investigation. On July 25, Troopers had responded to a report of a burglary in Unalakleet after residents had observed an unknown male running from their residence. The residents subsequently discovered an unclothed minor inside a bedroom in the residence, as well as a cell phone dropped by the suspect. Information and media on the cell phone identified Eakon as the suspect and provided evidence of Sexual Abuse of a Minor in the 1st Degree, Burglary in the 1st Degree, multiple counts of Production of Child Sexual Abuse Material (CSAM), and multiple counts of Possession of CSAM. Eakon was taken into custody with bail set at \$200,000.

Any charges reported in these press releases are merely accusations and the defendants are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.

NSED has arranged with the local municipal governments to conduct the NSED Member Representative elections. However, the NSED Member Representative election is not a municipal office and it will have a separate ballot. Voters do not need to be qualified to vote in the city's elections to be eligible to vote in the NSED election. Any registered voter who resides in a state election precinct that encompasses the member community, even if they live outside the community's municipal limits, is eligible to vote in the NSED Member Representative election. To check if you are registered to vote, visit the Alaska Division of Elections site: <https://myvoterinformation.alaska.gov/>

NSED Eligibility and Minimum Vote Requirements:

Candidate Eligibility: To be eligible as a candidate, an applicant:

- Must be a "resident fisher" of the community she or he wishes to represent, which is an individual:
 - with recent (within 10 years prior to the election), documented commercial or subsistence fishing activity;
 - who is a registered voter residing within the state precinct boundaries encompassing the member community, where the applicant maintains a mailing address and permanent domicile in the member community; and
 - eligible to receive an Alaska Permanent Fund Dividend, where the individual spends at least 20 days each month within the community from which they are filing for election and once elected, with the exception of regular vacations, travel for work-related business, board/commission obligations or medical reasons; and where the individual has resided for at least one (1) year immediately prior to the election.
- May not be currently employed by NSED in a regular position; and
- Must have "good moral character," which means that an individual:
 - is eligible for election as set forth in Article Five, Section 6 (see candidacy packet for more information);
 - has a history free of any felony convictions, including guilty pleas or pleas of nolo contendere, within the last 10 years;
 - has a criminal history free of any misdemeanor controlled substance convictions, including guilty pleas or pleas of nolo contendere, within the last 10 years; and
 - is able to pass a drug screen test, prior to the election, which is administered in accordance with NSED's employee drug and alcohol testing policies.

To determine eligibility, each applicant must complete a "Member Representative Candidacy Statement" and consent to a background check and drug test. You may pick up a candidacy packet with these forms and additional information from the city office or from the NSED Liaison in your community. Packets will be available by August 14, 2026.

Minimum Vote: The candidate receiving the highest number of votes and over 40% of the total votes cast shall be the elected NSED Member Representative.

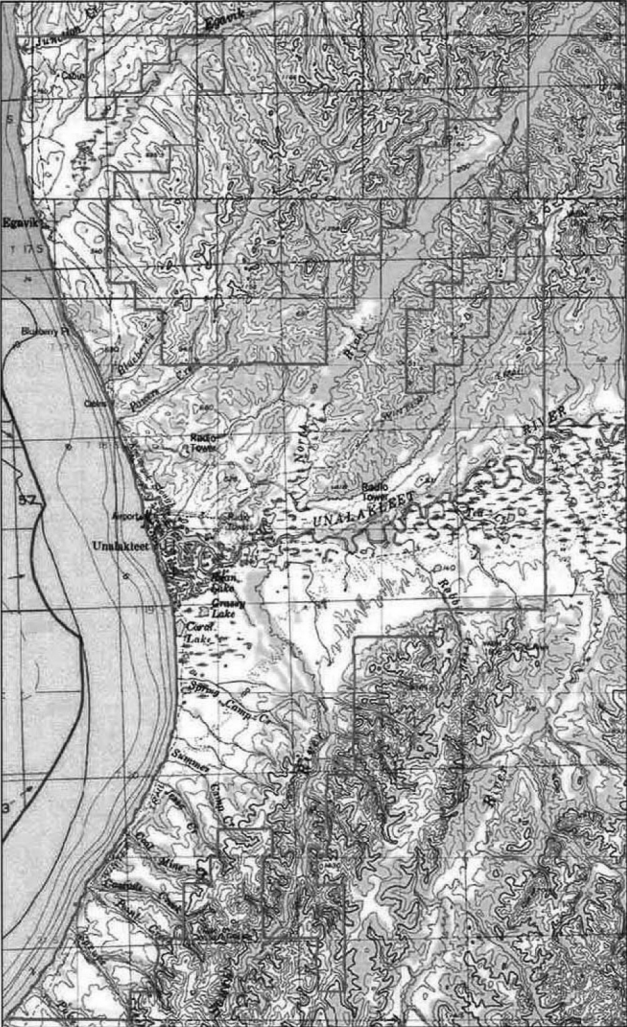
