Trooper Beat

Savoonga
Assault: On Oct. 9, 2025, a Village Public Safety Officer in Savoonga received a report of a domestic violence disturbance. The preliminary investigation indicated that Josephine Waghiyi, 36, attempted to shoot someone inside a residence, then stole a separate rifle and began driving through the community on an ATV and firing. Waghiyi approached the VPSO while they were stopped at a residence and pointed the rifle at the VPSO. A civilian saw this and rammed their own ATV into Waghiyi's vehicle, causing her rifle to fire in a different direction than the VPSO. Village Police Officers responded and pursued Waghiyi by ATV through the village. At one point, she turned around at a high speed and tried to hit the VPO. The VPO took evasive action to avoid her, but his ATV crashed as a result. The VPO sustained serious injuries and was medevacked for treatment. Waghiyi was taken into custody by the VPSO with assistance from the community. Troopers responded to the community by plane and Waghiyi was remanded to Anvil Mountain Correctional Center on charges of assault, theft and misconduct involving weapons.

UPDATE 5:50 p.m. Monday, Oct. 13, 2025: Alaska State Troopers responded to Kipnuk and confirmed there are no missing people. One adult female was located deceased in Kwigillingok. Troopers responded to recover her remains and are working to notify next of kin. Her name will be released once next of kin has been notified. Two people remain unaccounted for in the community.

The Alaska State Troopers are coordinating search and rescue efforts with the U.S. Coast Guard, Alaska Army National Guard and Alaska Air National Guard. Crews searched on Monday by boat and air. Alaska State Troopers launched Helo-2 from Fairbanks to Western Alaska to assist with additional needs. The helicopter will also deliver generators and additional fuel to the communities. Additional Regional Public Safety Officers and Village Public Safety Officers are traveling to Bethel and will deploy to impacted communities to assist as needed.

UPDATE, 11 a.m. Oct. 13, 2025: Search and rescue efforts continued overnight and at least 51 people and two dogs have been rescued from Kipnuk and Kwigillingok following the powerful storm system that impacted multiple coastal communities in Western Alaska over the weekend. Three people remain unaccounted for in Kwigillingok. Troopers have received secondhand reports of people who were unaccounted for in Kipnuk and are continuing efforts to confirm and verify how many people are missing. Aerial search assets were deployed at first light on Monday, Oct. 13. The Alaska State Troopers are continuing to coordinate search and rescue efforts with the U.S. Coast Guard, Alaska Army National Guard and Alaska Air National Guard. Anyone who needs non-emergency assistance can contact the State Emergency Operations Center at 907-428-7100.

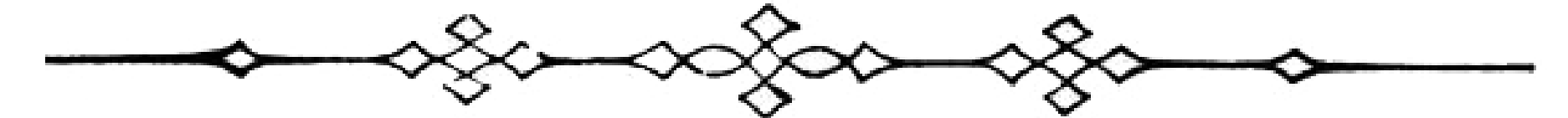

Alaska legislative committee finds state senator violated ethics rules before 2024 election

Democratic Fairbanks Sen. Scott Kawasaki violated ethics law by holding constituent events too close to the 2024 state primary, a panel of the Alaska Legislature concluded in a report published Friday.

The report was published by the Senate subcommittee of the Legislature’s Select Committee on Legislative Ethics, which recommended no penalty.

Under the Legislative Ethics Act, a legislator in a campaign cannot use state funds “to print or distribute a political mass mailing to individuals eligible to vote for the candidate” if the mailing takes place during a period that begins 60 days before the primary election and ends one day after the general election.

According to the report, Kawasaki e-mailed constituents a newsletter, distributed informational flyers and held a “Picnic in the Park” event to observe the opening of his office in Fairbanks.

Kawasaki, who defeated Republican Leslie Hajdukovich in the November general election, faced only Hajdukovich in the primary, making the race uncontested. In Alaska, the top four vote-getters advance from the primary election to the general election. Kawasaki and Hajdukovich were the only two registered candidates.

Kawasaki was first elected to the Alaska State House of Representatives in 2007, and to the Senate in 2019. He ran for re-election in 2024 to represent Senate District P.

Reached by phone on Friday, Kawasaki said that “it’s just sort of disappointing to have this be said and politicized, and then it becomes a potential issue in the future campaign.”

“It was a technical violation,” he said, “and I think it was unfairly weaponized against us just because of who we were running against.”

After the initial publication of this article, Hajdukovich said by text message that it was disappointing to see a “blatant violation” of the Ethics Act, “especially from someone who clearly knows better.”

“During the campaign, we raised these violations with Scott and his team as well as ethics officials — simply asking that they stop,” she wrote. “The ethics rules exist to protect public trust and ensure a level playing field. Using taxpayer resources for campaign purposes undermines both.”

The final report did not name the complainant, but Hajdukovich said it was filed by Barbara Tyndall. Public records show Tyndall is a member of the state school board, appointed by Gov. Mike Dunleavy.

By text message, Tyndall confirmed she filed the complaint and said, “The ethics committee was clear — Senator Scott Kawasaki violated Alaska’s ethics laws for personal political gain by using state resources, staff time and taxpayer dollars for campaign purposes.”

“This is not a ‘technical vio-

lation,’ as he claims, but a serious breach of public trust from an 18-year legislator who fully understands the rules,” she wrote. “The committee should require Senator Kawasaki to reimburse the state for any public funds used in violation of the law.”

Call for Nominations: Salmon Users

The Northern Bering Sea Regional Aquaculture Association (NoBSRAA) representing Norton Sound/Bering Strait salmon users is seeking nominations for a representative and alternate for the **Sport Fisher** user-group seat on its board of directors.

Necessary qualifications: To represent either group on the NoBSRAA, a nominee must maintain a permanent domicile and mailing address in any one of the following communities: Brevig Mission, Diomed, Elim, Gambell, Golovin, Koyuk, Nome, St. Michael, Savoonga, Shaktoolik, Stebbins, Teller, Unalakleet, Wales or White Mountain; and be eligible to receive an Alaska Permanent Fund dividend at that address for the entire term of office as director.

To represent sport fishers a nominee must be eligible to sport fish for salmon and have held a sport fishing license.

How to nominate: Petitions for the seat are available on the “Applications” link at www.nsedc.com (see QR code below), from NSEDC offices in Nome and Unalakleet, or from NSEDC community liaisons. Nomination petitions for the subsistence seat must have 10 signatures from 10 fellow regional residents who are eligible to sport fish for salmon.
